- Establish effective rental/financial assistance and rapid rehousing programs
- Protect and expand affordable housing stock through sensible legislation

AUDIT SPENDING & REDIRECT FUNDS

- Conduct a comprehensive audit of all homelessness-related spending
- Redirect dollars based on needs assessment and cost-effective planning
- End no-bid contracts and require data-driven performance metrics
